What's Happening in the Community

Communication Center: To increase communication in the community a new communication center has been established. A bulletin board and secure mail box has been installed by the clubhouse doors. With the new bulletin board, no more notices should be blown off the door!

The secure mailbox is for you! You may submit a work order, suggestions for improving your community, proxy voting when it is time to vote, or request to add an agenda item. All submission should include owner's name, unit#, and email/phone#.

Pool: A big shoutout to the owner(s) that took down the umbrellas and moved everything close to the building before the winds hit. Thank you!

Unit 606: Work on replacing the balcony has begun.

Neighborhood Watch: A number of people have been walking through the neighborhood at night, in addition to kids kicking garage doors. If you hear something, say something right away to Ameri-tech-Corev or the BODs.

The Beautification Committee: Rothmoor is once again applying for the Largo City Neighborhood Grant to assist in improving our landscape. We will be applying for an in-kind match of funds. This means rather than paying matching money we can do "volunteer hours" which is calculated at \$25/hrs. towards the match.

Example: If we apply for \$3000 grant then Largo City will provide \$1500 and Rothmoor would match \$1500. By using the "volunteer match" if Rothmoor owners invest 60 hours @ \$25/hour, there would be no outlay of funds from Rothmoor. This essentially means Rothmoor would have \$3000 toward landscaping without any lay out of money.

We present a much stronger application by demonstrating community involvement.

If you are interested in helping to get our 60 hours of service, please consider dedicating even 1 hour of your day doing one of the following:

This is done:

- 1. We need signatures from community showing support of project. Are you willing to meet with neighbors to get signatures?
- 2. Take before pictures of areas that are going to be replanted.

This needs to be done:

- 3. For the selected areas, assess water supply.
- 4. Assist in removal of dead plants from identified areas.

Note: The committee has started to remove dead plants as approved by the Board.

Let's talk water!

As we have seen from our budget everything is going up. Utility costs are accelerating just like insurance costs. Something to consider: if you are running your water waiting for it to get hot, collect that water in gallon jugs to be used to water your plants. The amount of wasted water in one shower may be as much as 2-5 gallons. In a week that is 14-35 gallons of water. Just something to think about since Pinellas County is in drought conditions.

On a serious matter:

How can Rothmoor reduce costs? Board Meetings: Did you know for every Board meeting that exceeds 2 hours, Rothmoor must pay \$50/hour?

To keep the meetings within or close to 1 hour, Board meetings will be structured so the maximum number of owners speak and so to help facilitate the Boards' ability to respond to issues in a timely manner.

- 1. For each meeting, the Board will provide an agenda along with the time of the meeting.
- 2. Each owner will have the opportunity to submit a request to add an item to the agenda; submit a written request 1 week prior the meeting with brief explanation of the issue. Each request must include the owner's name, unit #, and email or phone #, along with a brief explanation why this should be added to the agenda. The Board will review each item for consideration. You can use the mail box! NOTE: This will give the Board time to address the issue in a timely manner.
- 3. Each owner will have the opportunity to speak for 3 minutes, one time, on each agenda item. NOTE: This will give more owners the opportunity to speak within the meeting time frame.
