## Watering Restrictions (Updated February 2024)

The City of Largo purchases its potable water from Pinellas County. Watering restrictions for potable water and well or pond water are set by the county. The City of Largo's watering schedule is listed below.

### Times and Dates for Rothmoor Estates

May not water between 10am. - 4pm. May water one day a week, once a day.

Addresses ending in:	Authorized Watering Days:
Even numbers: 0,2,4,6,8,	Tuesdays
Odd numbers: 1,3,5,7,9	Thursdays
Mixed or No Address (such as common areas and other "no address" locations)	Thursdays

#### Violations

While under the Phase I Water Shortage Order, PCU will issue warnings that do not carry a fine for the 1<sup>st</sup> offense. A second offense will be a citation that carries a \$193.00 fine. Note: All citations will be the responsibility of the owner.

If drought conditions worsen and Phase 2 order is issued, any offense will receive a citation and fine of \$193.00 fine. For more information after receiving a citation, please contact Business & Customer Services at 727-464-4000.

#### Basic Rules

Wasteful and Unnecessary Usage of Water is Prohibited. This includes:

- 1. Leaving a hose on unattended.
- 2. Hand-watering a lawn on a restricted day when another method could be used.
- 3. Hosing down a driveway, solid surface, or structure when another method could be used.
- 4. Not fixing an irrigation or plumbing issue, like broken sprinkler heads or outdoor faucets, after receiving a verbal or written notice.

Doris Heisman, Manager of Florida Friendly Landscaping Program, was consulted for input. We are currently getting price quotes to remove dead plants.

# Rules & Regs Reminders



How is Rothmoor like the Indianapolis 500?

- The track is a rounded rectangle, with four distinct turns of identical dimensions, connected by four straightaways (two long straightaways and two "short chutes").

## March Fun Facts:

March 19 brings about the March equinox—also called the vernal or spring equinox in the Northern Hemisphere—marking the beginning of spring. Currently, the Sun crosses the celestial equator on its way north. Also, on this day, the Sun rises exactly in the east and sets exactly in the west—a good thing to know if you get lost in the woods.

You may have heard the weather proverb, "If March comes in like a lion, it will go out like a lamb," which means that if the month starts off stormy, it will end with mild weather. There is, however, a different interpretation: The constellation Leo, the lion, rises in the east at the beginning of March. Thus, the month "comes in like a lion," while Aries, the ram, sets in the west at the end of the month, and hence, the month "will go out like a lamb."

March's full Moon, **the Worm Moon**, reaches peak illumination on the morning of Monday, March 25, 2024. Look for it on the evening of Sunday, March 24, as the moon rises above the horizon!
